QUESTIONS - The following questions have been submitted:

1. Q: "The 0il lines will then be replaced with stainless steel hydraulic refrigeration tubing suitable for two (2) times the factory tested pressure of the machine." Are you referring to only the Oil Lines which have leaks, the Oil Lines which are bent, or All of the Oil Lines on the chiller?

A: All of the oil lines on the chiller. Tubing may not be brazed.

2. Q: "The contractor will then replace all the seals in a factory standard replacement seal kit, including the slide valve seals." York does not offer a Factory Seal Kit for the Oil Lines. They do offer a Shaft Seal Replacement Kit, however this was not mentioned in the RFQ. Was the intention to replace all of the seals and O-rings associated with the Oil Line Tubing? Did the customer want to replace the Compressor Shaft Seal?

A: Yes, all of the seals and O-Rings associated with the oil lines, also any sight glass or pressure control seals are to be replaced. Yes, the shaft seal is to be replaced.

3. Q: "The motor compressor coupling will be replaced and the shafts realigned using dial micrometers." Do you want the contractor to provide a New motor to compressor Coupling?

A: Yes, the replacement coupling is to be new.

Project Clarifications

1. As indicated at the bid meeting, the intention of this repair is to first fully leak check the machine, including eddy current testing of the tubes and tube sheets, and motor testing, prior to the start of repair. The leak checking will occur WHILE the oil analysis is at the lab. The piping connecting the chiller is mostly rolled groove.

The official bid date and time remain unchanged.

- 14. UNIT PRICE: Unit prices shall prevail in cases of a discrepancy in the Vendor's bid.
- 15. PREFERENCE: Vendor Preference may only be granted upon written request and only in accordance with the W. Va. Code § 5A-3-37 and the W. Va. Code R. A Vendor Preference Certificate form has been attached hereto to allow Vendor to apply for the preference. Vendor's failure to submit the Vendor Preference Certificate form with its bid will result in denial of Vendor Preference. Vendor Preference does not apply to construction projects.
- 16. SMALL, WOMEN-OWNED, OR MINORITY-OWNED BUSINESSES: For any solicitations publicly advertised for bid, in accordance with W. Va. Code §5A-3-37(a)(7) and W. Va.  - 2.3. "Contract" means the binding agreement that is entered into between the State and the Vendor to provide the goods or services requested in the Solicitation.
- 2.4. "Chief Procurement Officer" means the Chief Procurement Officer of the Division of Natural Resources or anyone that the Chief Procurement Officer has designated to perform a specific task or function.
- 2.5. "Property and Procurement Office" means the section within the Division headed by the Chief Procurement Officer and its personnel.
- 2.6. "Director of the Purchasing Division" means the Director of the West Virginia Department of Administration, Purchasing Division.
- 2.7. "Award Document" means the document signed by the Agency and the Property and Procurement Office and approved as to form by the Attorney General, that identifies the Vendor as the contract holder.
- 2.8. "Solicitation" means the official notice of an opportunity to supply the State with goods or services that is published by the Property and Procurement Office.
- 2.9. "State" means the State of West Virginia and/or any of its agencies, commissions, boards, etc. as context requires.
- 2.10. "Vendor" or "Vendors" means any entity submitting a bid in response to the Solicitation, the entity that has been selected as the lowest responsible bidder, or the entity that has been awarded the Contract as context requires.
- 2.11. "Will", "Shall" and "Must" identifies a mandatory item or requirement that is the duty, obligation, or requirement imposed is mandatory as opposed to being directory or permissive.

3. CONTRACT TERM; RENEWAL; EXTENSION: The term of this Contract shall be determined in accordance with the category that has been identified as applicable to this Contract below:

Initial Contract Term: This Contract becomes effective on and extends for a period of year(s).
Renewal Term: This Contract may be renewed upon the mutual written consent of the Agency, and the Vendor, with approval of the Property and Procurement Office and the Attorney General's office (Attorney General approval is as to form only). Any request for renewal should be submitted to the Property and Procurement Office thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date of the initial contract term or appropriate renewal term. A Contract renewal shall be in accordance with the terms and conditions of the original contract. Renewal of this Contract is limited to successive one (1) year periods or multiple renewal periods of less than one year, provided that the multiple renewal periods do not exceed months in total. Automatic renewal of this Contract is prohibited. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Property and Procurement Office approval is not required on agency delegated or exempt purchases. Attorney General approval may be required for vendor terms and conditions.
Delivery Order Limitations: In the event that this contract permits delivery orders, a delivery order may only be issued during the time this Contract is in effect. Open-End Contract: Quantities listed in this Solicitation are approximations only, based on estimates supplied by the Agency. It is understood and agreed that the Contract shall cover the quantities actually ordered for delivery during the term of the Contract, whether more or less than the quantities shown.
Service: The scope of the service to be provided will be more clearly defined in the specifications included herewith.
Combined Service and Goods: The scope of the service and deliverable goods to be provided will be more clearly defined in the specifications included herewith.
One-Time Purchase: This Contract is for the purchase of a set quantity of goods that are identified in the specifications included herewith. Once those items have been delivered, no additional goods may be procured under this Contract without an appropriate change order approved by the Vendor, Agency, and Attorney General's office.
6. EMERGENCY PURCHASES: Chief Procurement Officer may authorize the Agency to purchase goods or services in the open market that Vendor would otherwise provide under this Contract if those goods or services are for immediate or expedited delivery in an emergency. Emergencies shall include, but are not limited to, delays in transportation or an unanticipated increase in the volume of work. An emergency purchase in the open market, approved by the Chief Procurement Officer, shall not constitute of breach of this Contract and shall not entitle the Vendor to any form of compensation or damages. This provision does not excuse the State from fulfilling its obligations under a One-Time Purchase contract.
7. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: All of the items checked below must be provided to the Property and Procurement Office by the Vendor as specified below.

Subsequent to contract award, and prior to the insurance expiration date, Vendor shall provide the Agency with proof that the insurance mandated herein has been continued. Vendor must also provide Agency with immediate notice of any changes in its insurance policies mandated herein, including but not limited to, policy cancelation, policy reduction, or change in insurers. The insurance coverages identified below must be maintained throughout the life of this contract. - 9. WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE: The apparent successful Vendor shall comply with laws relating to workers' compensation, shall maintain workers' compensation insurance when required, and shall furnish proof of workers' compensation insurance upon request.
- 10. LITIGATION BOND: The Chief Procurement Officer reserves the right to require any Vendor that files a protest of an award to submit a litigation bond in the amount equal to one percent of the lowest bid submitted or \$5,000, whichever is greater. The entire amount of the bond shall be forfeited if the hearing officer determines that the protest was filed for frivolous or improper purpose, including but not limited to, the purpose of harassing, causing unnecessary delay, or needless expense for the Agency. All litigation bonds shall be made payable to the Property and Procurement Office. In lieu of a bond, the protester may submit a cashier's check or certified check payable to the Property and Procurement Office. Cashier's or certified checks will be deposited with and held by the State Treasurer's office. If it is determined that the protest has not been filed for frivolous or improper purpose, the bond or deposit shall be returned in its entirety.
- 11. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES: Vendor shall pay liquidated damages in the amount of \$100.00 per day for each day beyond the contract completion date. This clause shall in no way be considered exclusive and shall not limit the State or Agency's right to pursue any other available remedy.
- 12. ACCEPTANCE: Vendor's signature on its bid, or on the certification and signature page, constitutes an offer to the State that cannot be unilaterally withdrawn, signifies that the product or service proposed by vendor meets the mandatory requirements contained in the Solicitation for that product or service, unless otherwise indicated, and signifies acceptance of the terms and conditions contained in the Solicitation unless otherwise indicated.
- 13. PRICING: The pricing set forth herein is firm for the life of the Contract, unless specified elsewhere within this Solicitation/Contract by the State. A Vendor's inclusion of price adjustment provisions in its bid, without an express authorization from the State in the Solicitation to do so, may result in bid disqualification.
- 14. PAYMENT: Payment in advance is prohibited under this Contract. Payment may only be made after the delivery and acceptance of goods or services. The Vendor shall submit invoices, in arrears.
- 15. PURCHASING CARD ACCEPTANCE: The State of West Virginia currently utilizes a Purchasing Card program, administered under contract by a banking institution, to process payment for goods and services. The Vendor must accept the State of West Virginia's Purchasing Card for payment of all orders under this Contract unless the box below is checked.
- Vendor is not required to accept the State of West Virginia's Purchasing Card as payment for all goods and services.

- 16. TAXES: The Vendor shall pay any applicable sales, use, personal property or any other taxes arising out of this Contract and the transactions contemplated thereby. The State of West Virginia is exempt from federal and state taxes and will not pay or reimburse such taxes.
- 17. ADDITIONAL FEES: Vendor is not permitted to charge additional fees or assess additional charges that were not either expressly provided for in the solicitation published by the State of West Virginia or included in the unit price or lump sum bid amount that Vendor is required by the solicitation to provide. Including such fees or charges as notes to the solicitation may result in rejection of vendor's bid. Requesting such fees or charges be paid after the contract has been awarded may result in cancellation of the contract.
- 18. FUNDING: This Contract shall continue for the term stated herein, contingent upon funds being appropriated by the Legislature or otherwise being made available. In the event funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available, this Contract becomes void and of no effect beginning on July 1 of the fiscal year for which funding has not been appropriated or otherwise made available.
- 19. CANCELLATION: The Chief Procurement Officer reserves the right to cancel this Contract immediately upon written notice to the vendor if the materials or workmanship supplied do not conform to the specifications contained in the Contract. The Chief Procurement Office may also cancel any purchase or Contract upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Vendor in accordance with West Virginia Division of Natural Resources Series IV Purchasing Guidelines and Procedures, § 5.2.
- 20. TIME: Time is of the essence with regard to all matters of time and performance in this Contract.
- 21. APPLICABLE LAW: This Contract is governed by and interpreted under West Virginia law without giving effect to its choice of law principles. Any information provided in specification manuals, or any other source, verbal or written, which contradicts or violates the West Virginia Constitution, West Virginia Code or West Virginia Code of State Rules is void and of no effect.
- 22. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: Vendor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and ordinances. By submitting a bid, Vendor acknowledges that it has reviewed, understands, and will comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and ordinances.
- 23. ARBITRATION: Any references made to arbitration contained in this Contract, Vendor's bid, or in any American Institute of Architects documents pertaining to this Contract are hereby deleted, void, and of no effect.

- 24. MODIFICATIONS: This writing is the parties' final expression of intent. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Contract to the contrary no modification of this Contract shall be binding without mutual written consent of the Agency, and the Vendor, with approval of the Property and Procurement Office and the Attorney General's office (Attorney General approval is as to form only). Any change to existing contracts that adds work or changes contract cost, and were not included in the original contract, must be approved by the Property and Procurement Office and the Attorney General's Office (as to form) prior to the implementation of the change or commencement of work affected by the change.
- 25. WAIVER: The failure of either party to insist upon a strict performance of any of the terms or provision of this Contract, or to exercise any option, right, or remedy herein contained, shall not be construed as a waiver or a relinquishment for the future of such term, provision, option, right, or remedy, but the same shall continue in full force and effect. Any waiver must be expressly stated in writing and signed by the waiving party.
- 26. SUBSEQUENT FORMS: The terms and conditions contained in this Contract shall supersede any and all subsequent terms and conditions which may appear on any form documents submitted by Vendor to the Agency such as price lists, order forms, invoices, sales agreements, or maintenance agreements, and includes internet websites or other electronic documents. Acceptance or use of Vendor's forms does not constitute acceptance of the terms and conditions contained thereon.
- 27. ASSIGNMENT: Neither this Contract nor any monies due, or to become due hereunder, may be assigned by the Vendor without the express written consent of the Agency, the Attorney General's office (as to form only), and any other government agency or office that may be required to approve such assignments. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Property and Procurement Office approval may or may not be required on certain agency delegated or exempt purchases.
- 28. WARRANTY: The Vendor expressly warrants that the goods and/or services covered by this Contract will: (a) conform to the specifications, drawings, samples, or other description furnished or specified by the Agency; (b) be merchantable and fit for the purpose intended; and (c) be free from defect in material and workmanship.
- 29. STATE EMPLOYEES: State employees are not permitted to utilize this Contract for personal use and the Vendor is prohibited from permitting or facilitating the same.
- 30. BANKRUPTCY: In the event the Vendor files for bankruptcy protection, the State of West Virginia may deem this Contract null and void, and terminate this Contract without notice.
- 31. PRIVACY, SECURITY, AND CONFIDENTIALITY: The Vendor agrees that it will not disclose to anyone, directly or indirectly, any such personally identifiable information or other confidential information gained from the Agency, unless the individual who is the subject of the information consents to the disclosure in writing or the disclosure is made pursuant to the Agency's policies, procedures, and rules. Vendor further agrees to comply with the Confidentiality Policies and Information Security Accountability Requirements, set forth in http://www.state.wv.us/admin/purchase/privacy/default.html.

32. YOUR SUBMISSION IS A PUBLIC DOCUMENT: Vendor's entire response to the Solicitation and the resulting Contract are public documents. As public documents, they will be disclosed to the public following the bid/proposal opening or award of the contract, as required by the competitive bidding laws of W. Va. Code §§ 5A-3-1 et seq., 5-22-1 et seq., and 5G-1-1 et seq. and the Freedom of Information Act W. Va. Code §§ 29B-1-1 et seq.

DO NOT SUBMIT MATERIAL YOU CONSIDER TO BE CONFIDENTIAL, A TRADE SECRET, OR OTHERWISE NOT SUBJECT TO PUBLIC DISCLOSURE.

Submission of any bid, proposal, or other document to the Property and Procurement Office constitutes your explicit consent to the subsequent public disclosure of the bid, proposal, or document. The Property and Procurement Office will disclose any document labeled "confidential," "proprietary," "trade secret," "private," or labeled with any other claim against public disclosure of the documents, to include any "trade secrets" as defined by W. Va. Code \S 47-22-1 et seq. All submissions are subject to public disclosure without notice.

- 33. LICENSING: In accordance with West Virginia Division of Natural Resources Series IV Purchasing Guidelines and Policies, §6.1.d.1., Vendor must be licensed and in good standing in accordance with any and all state and local laws and requirements by any state or local agency of West Virginia, including, but not limited to, the West Virginia Secretary of State's Office, the West Virginia Tax Department, West Virginia Insurance Commission, or any other state agency or political subdivision. Upon request, the Vendor must provide all necessary releases to obtain information to enable the Property and Procurement Office's Chief Procurement Officer or the Agency to verify that the Vendor is licensed and in good standing with the above entities.
- 34. ANTITRUST: In submitting a bid to, signing a contract with, or accepting a Award Document from any agency of the State of West Virginia, the Vendor agrees to convey, sell, assign, or transfer to the State of West Virginia all rights, title, and interest in and to all causes of action it may now or hereafter acquire under the antitrust laws of the United States and the State of West Virginia for price fixing and/or unreasonable restraints of trade relating to the particular commodities or services purchased or acquired by the State of West Virginia. Such assignment shall be made and become effective at the time the purchasing agency tenders the initial payment to Vendor.
- 35. VENDOR CERTIFICATIONS: By signing its bid or entering into this Contract, Vendor certifies (1) that its bid or offer was made without prior understanding, agreement, or connection with any corporation, firm, limited liability company, partnership, person or entity submitting a bid or offer for the same material, supplies, equipment or services; (2) that its bid or offer is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud; (3) that this Contract is accepted or entered into without any prior understanding, agreement, or connection to any other entity that could be considered a violation of law; and (4) that it has reviewed this Solicitation in its entirety; understands the requirements, terms and conditions, and other information contained herein.

Vendor's signature on its bid or offer also affirms that neither it nor its representatives have any interest, nor shall acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would compromise the

performance of its services bereunder. Any such interests shall be promptly presented in detail to the Agency. The individual signing this bid or offer on behalf of Vendor certifies that he or she is authorized by the Vendor to execute this bid or offer or any documents related thereto on Vendor's behalf; that he or she is authorized to bind the Vendor in a contractual relationship; and that, to the best of his or her knowledge, the Vendor has properly registered with any State agency that may require registration.

36. VENDOR RELATIONSHIP: The relationship of the Vendor to the State shall be that of an independent contractor and no principal-agent relationship or employer-employee relationship is contemplated or created by this Contract. The Vendor as an independent contractor is solely liable for the acts and omissions of its employees and agents. Vendor shall be responsible for selecting, supervising, and compensating any and all individuals employed pursuant to the terms of this Solicitation and resulting contract. Neither the Vendor, nor any employees or subcontractors of the Vendor, shall be deemed to be employees of the State for any purpose whatsoever. Vendor shall be exclusively responsible for payment of employees and contractors for all wages and salaries, taxes, withholding payments, penalties, fees, fringe benefits, professional liability insurance premiums, contributions to insurance and pension, or other deferred compensation plans, including but not limited to, Workers' Compensation and Social Security obligations, licensing fees, etc. and the filing of all necessary documents, forms, and returns pertinent to all of the foregoing.

Vendor shall hold harmless the State, and shall provide the State and Agency with a defense against any and all claims including, but not limited to, the foregoing payments, withholdings, contributions, taxes, Social Security taxes, and employer income tax returns.

- 37. INDEMNIFICATION: The Vendor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the State and the Agency, their officers, and employees from and against: (1) Any claims or losses for services rendered by any subcontractor, person, or firm performing or supplying services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of the Contract; (2) Any claims or losses resulting to any person or entity injured or damaged by the Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors by the publication, translation, reproduction, delivery, performance, use, or disposition of any data used under the Contract in a manner not authorized by the Contract, or by Federal or State statutes or regulations; and (3) Any failure of the Vendor, its officers, employees, or subcontractors to observe State and Federal laws including, but not limited to, labor and wage and hour laws.
- 38. PURCHASING AFFIDAVIT: In accordance with W.Va. Code § 5-22-1(i), the contracting public entity shall not award a contract for a construction project to any bidder that is known to be in default on any monetary obligation owed to the state or a political subdivision of the state, including, but not limited to, obligations related to payroll taxes, property taxes, sales and use taxes, fire service fees, or other fines or fees. Accordingly, prior to contract award, Vendors are required to sign, notarize, and submit the Purchasing Affidavit to the Property and Procurement Office affirming under oath that it is not in default on any monetary obligation owed to the state or a political subdivision of the state.

- 39. ADDITIONAL AGENCY AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT USE: This Contract may be utilized by other agencies, spending units, and political subdivisions of the State of West Virginia; county, municipal, and other local government bodies; and school districts ("Other Government Entities"). Any extension of this Contract to the aforementioned, Other Government Entities must be on the same prices, terms, and conditions as those offered and agreed to in this Contract, provided that such extension is in compliance with the applicable laws, rules, and ordinances of the Other Government Entity. If the Vendor does not wish to extend the prices, terms, and conditions of its bid and subsequent contract to the Other Government Entities, the Vendor must clearly indicate such refusal in its bid. A refusal to extend this Contract to the Other Government Entities shall not impact or influence the award of this Contract in any manner.
- 40. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: Vendor, its officers or members or employees, shall not presently have or acquire an interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict with or compromise the performance of its obligations hereunder. Vendor shall periodically inquire of its officers, members, and employees to ensure that a conflict of interest does not arise. Any conflict of interest discovered shall be promptly presented in detail to the Agency.
- 41. REPORTS: Vendor shall provide the Agency with the following reports identified by a checked box below:

- 42. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC STEEL PRODUCTS: Except when authorized by the Director of the Purchasing Division pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56, no contractor may use or supply steel products for a State Contract Project other than those steel products made in the United States. A contractor who uses steel products in violation of this section may be subject to civil penalties pursuant to W. Va. Code § 5A-3-56. As used in this section:
- a. "State Contract Project" means any erection or construction of, or any addition to, alteration of or other improvement to any building or structure, including, but not limited to, roads or highways, or the installation of any heating or cooling or ventilating plants or other equipment, or the supply of and materials for such projects, pursuant to a contract with the State of West Virginia for which bids were solicited on or after June 6, 2001.
- b. "Steel Products" means products rolled, formed, shaped, drawn, extruded, forged, cast, fabricated or otherwise similarly processed, or processed by a combination of two or more or such operations, from steel made by the open heath, basic oxygen, electric furnace, Bessemer or other steel making process. The Purchasing Division Director may, in writing, authorize the use of foreign steel products if:

- c. The cost for each contract item used does not exceed one tenth of one percent (.1%) of the total contract cost or two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), whichever is greater. For the purposes of this section, the cost is the value of the steel product as delivered to the project; or
- d. The Director of the Purchasing Division determines that specified steel materials are not produced in the United States in sufficient quantity or otherwise are not reasonably available to meet contract requirements.
- 43. PREFERENCE FOR USE OF DOMESTIC ALUMINUM, GLASS, AND STEEL: In Accordance with W. Va. Code § 5-19-1 et seq., and W. Va. CSR § 148-10-1 et seq., for every contract or subcontract, subject to the limitations contained herein, for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, improvement or maintenance of public works or for the purchase of any item of machinery or equipment to be used at sites of public works, only domestic aluminum, glass or steel products shall be supplied unless the spending officer determines, in writing, after the receipt of offers or bids, (1) that the cost of domestic aluminum, glass or steel products is unreasonable or inconsistent with the public interest of the State of West Virginia, (2) that domestic aluminum, glass or steel products are not produced in sufficient quantities to meet the contract requirements, or (3) the available domestic aluminum, glass, or steel do not meet the contract specifications. This provision only applies to public works contracts awarded in amount more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or public works contracts that require more than ten thousand pounds of steel products.

The cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than twenty percent (20%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products. If the domestic aluminum, glass or steel products to be supplied or produced in a "substantial labor surplus area", as defined by the United States Department of Labor, the cost of domestic aluminum, glass, or steel products may be unreasonable if the cost is more than thirty percent (30%) of the bid or offered price for foreign made aluminum, glass, or steel products.

This preference shall be applied to an item of machinery or equipment, as indicated above, when the item is a single unit of equipment or machinery manufactured primarily of aluminum, glass or steel, is part of a public works contract and has the sole purpose or of being a permanent part of a single public works project. This provision does not apply to equipment or machinery purchased by a spending unit for use by that spending unit and not as part of a single public works project.

All bids and offers including domestic aluminum, glass or steel products that exceed bid or offer prices including foreign aluminum, glass or steel products after application of the preferences provided in this provision may be reduced to a price equal to or lower than the lowest bid or offer price for foreign aluminum, glass or steel products plus the applicable preference. If the reduced bid or offer prices are made in writing and supersede the prior bid or offer prices, all bids or offers, including the reduced bid, or offer prices, will be reevaluated in accordance with this rule.

44. INTERESTED PARTY SUPPLEMENTAL DISCLOSURE: W. Va. Code § 6D-1-2 requires that for contracts with an actual or estimated value of at least \$100,000, the vendor must submit to the Agency a supplemental disclosure of interested parties reflecting any new or differing interested parties to the contract, which were not included in the original pre-award interested party disclosure, within 30 days following the completion or termination of the contract. The Agency shall submit a copy of the disclosure to the Ethics Commission within fifteen (15) days after receiving the supplemental disclosure of interested parties.

ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS (Construction Contracts Only)

1. CONTRACTOR'S LICENSE: W. Va. Code § 21-11-2 requires that all persons desiring to perform contracting work in this state be licensed. The West Virginia Contractors Licensing Board is empowered to issue the contractor's license. Applications for a contractor's license may be made by contacting the West Virginia Division of Labor. W. Va. Code § 21-11-11 requires any prospective Vendor to include the contractor's license number on its bid. If an apparent low bidder fails to submit a license number in accordance with this section, the Property and Procurement Office will promptly request by telephone and electronic mail that the low bidder and the second low bidder provide the license number within one business day of the request. Failure of the bidder to provide the license number within one business day of receiving the request shall result in disqualification of the bid. Vendors should include a contractor's license number in the space provided below.

- 1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE: The West Virginia Division of Natural Resources is soliciting bids on behalf of the Parks and Recreation section to establish a contract for certain manitenace and repairs to the Lodge Chillers at Pipestern Resort State Park.
- 2. DEFINITIONS: The terms listed below shall have the meanings assigned to them below. Additional definitions can be found in section 2 of the General Terms and Conditions.
 - 2.1 "Contract Services" means certain manitenace and repairs to the Lodge Chillers at Pipestem Resort State Park as more fully described in these specifications.
 - 2.2 "Pricing Page" means the pages, contained wvOASIS or attached hereto as Exhibit A, upon which Vendor should list its proposed price for the Contract Services.
 - 2.3 "Solicitation" means the official notice of an opportunity to supply the State with goods or services that is published by the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources.
- 3. QUALIFICATIONS: Vendor, or Vendor's staff if requirements are inherently limited to individuals rather than corporate entities, shall have the following minimum qualifications:
 - 3.1 The contractor performing the work must have ten (10) years of documented experience performing similar work. The service technician performing the work must also have ten (10) years of documented experience performing similar work on similar systems at no more than three (3) different companies in the last ten (10) years. Owner reserves the right to review and act upon the documentation of this requirement prior to the award of a contract. Failure to provide the documentation or providing incomplete, inconclusive, or inaccurate documentation may result in the rejection of the contractor's bid
- 4. MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS:

4.1 Mandatory Contract Services Requirements and Deliverables: Contract Services must meet or exceed the mandatory requirements listed below.

Background:

McKeever Lodge at Pipestern State Park, located in county, has two (2) York water cooled rotary screw liquid chillers, model YSBBBS1, with Frick compressors, serving the facility. The chillers serve for building cooling and utilize water (no glycol) on both the condenser and evaporator sides of the machine. The chillers require significant maintenance including testing, parts changes and seal and oil line replacements and repairs. The chillers have serial numbers SDEM-970080 and SDEM-970200. All specified and required work will be fully performed on each chiller, regardless of the use of the terms "chiller" or "chillers".

Pre-Repair Testing:

The contractor will draw two (2) oil analysis samples from each chiller. One (1) will be delivered to the Owner, the second (2^{nd}) will be sent for lab analysis. The oil analysis results must be received and reviewed by the Owner prior to the start of any other work on the chillers.

Repair Requirements:

Contractor will remove the refrigerant and pressurize the machine to the original factory testing pressure and leak checked with a digital leak detector. Additionally, every piping connection and seal will be visually inspected using soap bubbles as part of the leak check. The tube sheet headers and tubes in the evaporator and condenser will be leak checked as part of the leak check process.

The oil lines will then be replaced with stainless steel hydraulic refrigeration tubing suitable for two (2) times the factory tested pressure of the machine. The tubing shall be bent using a hydraulic bender to match the routing and bends of the tubing being replaced. The contractor will then replace all the seals in a factory standard replacement seal kit, including the slide valve seals. The oil heater element and thermostat or heater control relay will be replaced. The slide valve MSV solenoid assembly will be replaced. The motor to compressor coupling will be replaced and the shafts re-aligned using dial micrometers. Alignment will be witnessed by the Owner. The control board memory batteries will be replaced.

Once all the tubing, seals, and parts have been replaced, the chillers will be re- pressurized using nitrogen and the pressure test repeated. Any remaining leaks will be repaired and the test reperformed until no leaks are detected. The chiller will be left under nitrogen for twenty-four (24) hours, with a digital pressure gauge left in place, as a final check.

The chiller condenser and evaporator tubes will be cleaned using a rotary brush tubing cleaner. The chiller water filter screens will be cleaned and inspected. The chiller flow switched will be replaced.

Contractor will perform MegOhm insulation resistance tests on the motor windings and record the results.

Any concerns noted beyond the scope of the above requirements will be reported to the Owner, in detailed writing, prior to start of evacuation of the refrigeration circuit.

Once the chillers are deemed ready for refrigerant, they will be fully evacuated to a 500 Micron minimum and new oil, filters and oil filter dryers will be installed. New refrigerant will added and the chiller will be leaked checked again.

W. VA. ALCOHOL & DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE ACT POLICY

Introduction¹

Casto Technical Services ("CTS") is committed to maintaining a drug and alcohol-free workplace. Drug and alcohol use, and/or the unlawful possession or use of controlled substances directly affects job performance, threatens the safety of co-workers, other workers, and the public, and is inconsistent with the behavior expected of a CTS employee. CTS believes that a working environment, free of drug and alcohol use, is healthier, safer, more productive, and is a condition desired by most employees and their families. Therefore, employees must adhere to the following:

- The unlawful use, possession, manufacture, distribution, sale or dispensation of drugs on company premises or while conducting company business off premises is strictly forbidden.
- The possession or use of alcohol on company premises or while conducting company business is strictly forbidden.
- Being under the influence of alcohol or an illegal substance on company premises, or while conducting company business, or while driving a company supplied vehicle is strictly forbidden.
- Employees whose physician has prescribed a drug or controlled substance that might adversely affect their ability to perform their work must provide a written statement from their doctor.
- Any use, possession, manufacturing, distribution, sale or dispensation of illegal drugs off premises and off company time that
 adversely affect the individual's work performance, his or her own or others' safety at work, or the company=s reputation in
 the community is strictly forbidden.
- Fallure to adhere to the requirements of any drug treatment or counseling program in which the employee is enrolled is
 grounds for disciplinary action, up to and including termination.
- Violations of this policy will result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination, and may have legal consequences.

Applicability

CTS will conduct drug and alcohol testing of employees engaged in safety-sensitive duties or working in construction on state public improvements pursuant to the provisions of the W. Va. Alcohol & Drug-Free Workplace Act.

CTS will also conduct pre-employment testing of employees hired to engage in the same work.

Types of Drug & Alcohol Testing

- 1. PRE-EMPLOYMENT DRUG TESTING: CTS shall conduct pre-employment drug testing of all new employees hired to perform safety-sensitive duties. If the newly hired employee does not pass the drug test, then the employee is not eligible for employment with the company.
- 2. RANDOM DRUG TESTING: CTS shall conduct random drug testing that annually tests at least ten percent (10%) of the company employees who perform safety- sensitive duties.
- 3. POST ACCIDENT DRUG OR ALCOHOL TESTING: CTS shall conduct a drug or alcohol test of any employee who may have caused or contributed to an accident while conducting job duties where reasonable cause exists to suspect that the employee may be intoxicated or under the influence of a controlled substance not prescribed by the employee's physician. The drug or alcohol test shall be conducted as soon as possible after the accident occurs and after any necessary medical attention has been administered to the employee.

¹ Casto Technical Services incorporates by reference the provisions of the W. Va. Alcohol and Drug-Free Workplace Act (W. Va. Code Section 21-1D-1 et seq.) as if specifically addressed herein, including the definitions set forth in Section 21-1D-2.

4. REASONABLE CAUSE DRUG OR ALCOHOL TESTING: CTS shall conduct a drug or alcohol test of any employee when there is reasonable cause to believe that the employee has reported to work or is working under the influence of a drug of abuse or alcohol.

Medical Review Officer

- 1. CTS shall designate a qualified Medical Review Officer ("MRO") to review and interpret laboratory results.
- 2. The MRO will determine whether there is a legitimate medical explanation for a laboratory-confirmed positive, adulterated, or substituted result; and review and report a verified result in a timely and confidential manner.
- The MRO shall review all drug tests yielding a positive result.
- 4. The MRO shall review collection and testing procedures to help ensure that appropriate procedures are being followed.

Testing Protocols

- All drug tests performed shall be conducted by a laboratory certified by the United States Department of Health and Human Services or its successor.
- 2. Urine specimens of individuals shall be collected in a scientifically or medically approved manner and under reasonable and sanitary conditions.
- 3. The collection and testing of urine specimens will be done with due regard for the privacy of the individual being tested and in a manner reasonably calculated to prevent substitutions or interference with the collection and testing of specimens.
- 4. Documentation of urine specimens will be done through procedures that reasonably preclude the possibility of erroneous identification of test results, and that provide the individual being tested a reasonable opportunity to furnish information identifying any prescription or nonprescription drugs used by the individual in connection with a medical condition to the Medical Review Officer.
- 5. The collection, maintenance, storage, and transportation of urine specimens will be done in a manner that reasonably precludes the possibility of contamination or adulteration of the specimens.
- 6. The testing of a urine specimen of an individual to determine if the individual Ingested, was injected, or otherwise introduced with a drug of abuse, will be done in a manner that conforms to scientifically accepted analytical methods and procedures that include verification and confirmation of any positive test result by gas chromatography or mass spectrometry.
- 7. Alcohol testing will be done in a scientifically or medically approved manner, which will include an approved screening device (sallva swap, breath tube) or an Evidential Breath Testing device (breathalyzer). All confirmation alcohol testing will be done with an Evidential Breath Testing device.

Designated Testing or Collection Site

- 1. Drug Testing: CTS shall designate appropriate sites to be used for the collection of urine samples. The collector shall be responsible for maintaining collection site security and integrity as followed in federally mandated drug and alcohol testing programs or otherwise accepted as the industry standard.
- Alcohol Testing: CTS shall designate appropriate sites to be used for alcohol testing.

Employee Preparation for Testing

- 1. When an employee is notified of selection for testing, he or she must proceed immediately to the collection site.
- 2. Employee must have photo identification.
- Employees may be accompanied to the collection or testing site.
- Collectors and Breath Alcohol Technicians may come to the worksite to collect specimens, without advanced notice.

Laboratory

For testing urine samples, CTS will use <u>LabCorp</u>, as its primary testing laboratory. This laboratory is a DHHS-certified laboratory. CTS may at its discretion, designate another laboratory for urine testing.

The laboratory shall receive, analyze, and report laboratory confirmed results to the MRO.

Reasonable Cause Suspension from Safety-Sensitive Duties

if CTS has reasonable cause to believe an employee is under the influence of a drug of abuse or alcohol at work and requires the employee to take a drug or alcohol test, the employee shall immediately be suspended from performing safety-sensitive tasks until such time as a drug or alcohol test is performed and results of that test are available.

3. Any employee testing positive for a drug of abuse shall be discharged.

Phencyclidine Propoxyphene

Alcohol Screening

- 1. If the initial alcohol screening test shows an alcohol concentration of less than 0.02, the testing procedure is completed.
- 2. If the alcohol concentration is 0.02 or greater, then there will be a separate confirmation test conducted using an Evidential Breath Testing device.

300

The breath alcohol technician will wait 15 minutes, but not more than 30 minutes, before conducting the confirmation test.

During this time, the employee is not allowed to eat, drink, smoke, belch, put anything in his or her mouth or leave the testing area.

3. 0.04 or greater:

² These cut-off levels are federally-recognized standards.

A confirmed test result of 0.04 or greater shall result in disciplinary action up to and including discharge. If the employee is not discharged, any return to duty will be contingent on successful completion of the company's return to duty program, which may include evaluation by a substance abuse professional, successful completion of any education, counseling or treatment prescribed by the substance abuse professional prior to returning to work, and provide a negative test result for drugs and a breath test less than 0.02 of alcohol. If the employee is not discharged, he or she shall be subjected to random drug and alcohol testing at any time for one year after the positive test.

0.08 or greater:

A confirmed test result of .08 or greater will result in immediate discharge.

Contesting Positive Results

1. Drug Testing

An employee may contest a positive drug test result by contacting the MRO within seventy-two (72) hours of notification of a positive result.

Challenge testing will be performed on the untested second portion of the split sample. The employee may request that the MRO direct that a different certified laboratory perform the test.

There are no cut-off levels applicable to the split sample testing.

The employee must pay any costs or fees associated with the challenge test.

2. Alcohol Testing

An employee may contest a positive alcohol test by contacting the MRO within twenty-four (24) hours of notification of a positive result.

The MRO shall review the alcohol testing procedure and examine any alternate medical explanations for a positive test result and report any findings to the Policy Coordinator. Thereafter, CTS will review the matter and make a decision concerning the employee's status.

Refusing to Consent to Testing

- 1. Employees refusing to consent to drug or alcohol testing shall be discharged from employment.
- A newly hired employee that refuses to consent to pre-employment drug testing shall no longer be eligible for employment with the company,
- If an employee is caught adulterating a drug or alcohol test, the employee shall be discharged from employment.
- 4. If a newly hired employee is caught adulterating a pre-employment drug test, the employee shall no longer be eligible for employment with the company.

Employee Assistance

- 1. CTS shall provide to any employee testing positive for a drug of abuse or alcohol, a list of community resources where employees may seek assistance for themselves or their families.
- 2. CTS shall assist an employee who voluntarily acknowledges that the employee may have a substance abuse problem by providing a list of community resources where employees may seek assistance for themselves or their families.
- 3. See attached List of Community Resources where employees may seek assistance for themselves or their families.

Employee Training

1. <u>Employee Training</u>

CTS will provide within six (6) weeks of new employment, at least two (2) hours of drug-free workplace employee education for all employees unless the employee has already received such training at anytime within a prior two-year period.

The employee shall participate in drug-free workplace employee education at least biannually thereafter.

The employee education shall include, but may not be limited to the following:

- a) Explanation about the content of the company's alcohol and drug-free workplace policy.
- b) Employees shall have the opportunity to ask questions regarding the policy.
- c) Employees shall receive a hard copy of the written policy.
- Employees shall sign a document acknowledging receipt of the hard copy of the written policy.
- e) Employees shall receive a specific explanation of the basics of drugs and alcohol abuse, including, but not limited to the disease model, signs and symptoms associated with substance abuse, and the effects and dangers of drugs or alcohol in the workplace.
 - f) Employees shall receive a list of community resources where employees may seek assistance for themselves or their families.

2. Supervisor Training

CTS will provide at least two (2) hours of drug-free workplace supervisor training for supervisory employees and annually thereafter. The supervisor training shall include the following:

- a) How to recognize a possible drug or alcohol problem;
- b) How to document behaviors that demonstrate a drug or alcohol problem;
- c) How to confront employees with the problem from observed behaviors;
- d) How to initiate reasonable suspicion and post-accident testing;
- e) How to handle the procedures associated with random testing;
- f) How to make an appropriate referral for assessment and assistance; and
- g) How to follow up with employees returning to work after a positive test.

Confidentiality and Recordkeeping

- All drug and alcohol testing information specifically related to individual employees is confidential and should be treated as such by anyone authorized to review or compile program records.
- 2. No information about any individual test result shall be released without written authorization of the tested employee with the exception of the following: The W. Va. Alcohol and Drug-Free Workplace Act does provide for inspection of records by the public authority which let the contract and its officers and agents.

CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS: Under W. Va. Code § 5-22-1(i), the contracting public entity shall not award a construction contract to any bidder that is known to be in default on any monetary obligation owed to the state or a political subdivision of the state, including, but not limited to, obligations related to payroll taxes, property taxes, sales and use taxes, fire service fees, or other fines or fees.

ALL CONTRACTS: Under W. Va. Code §5A-3-10a, no contract or renewal of any contract may be awarded by the state or any of its political subdivisions to any vendor or prospective vendor when the vendor or prospective vendor or a related party to the vendor or prospective vendor is a debtor and: (1) the debt owed is an amount greater than one thousand dollars in the aggregate; or (2) the debtor is in employer default.

"Debt" means any assessment, premium, penalty, fine, tax or other amount of money owed to the state or any of its political subdivisions because of a judgment, fine, permit violation, license assessment, defaulted workers' compensation premium, penalty or other assessment presently definquent or due and required to be paid to the state or any of its political subdivisions, including any interest or additional penalties accrued thereon.

"Employer default" means having an outstanding balance or liability to the old fund or to the uninsured employers' fund or being in policy default, as defined in W. Va. Code § 23-20-2, failure to maintain mandatory workers' compensation coverage, or failure to fully meet its obligations as a workers' compensation self-insured employer. An employer is not in employer default if it has entered into a repayment agreement with the insurance Commissioner and remains in compliance with the obligations under the repayment agreement.

"Related party" means a party, whether an individual, corporation, pertnership, association, limited liability company or any other form or business association or other entity whatsoever, related to any vendor by blood, marriage, ownership or contract through which the party has a relationship of ownership or other interest with the vendor so that the party will actually or by effect receive or control a portion of the benefit, profit or other consideration from performance of a vendor contract with the party receiving an amount that meets or exceed five percent of the total contract amount.

AFFIRMATION: By signing this form, the vendor's authorized signer affirms and acknowledges under penalty of law for false swearing (W. Vs. Code §81-5-3) that: (1) for construction contracts, the vendor is not in default on any monetary obligation owed to the state or a political subdivision of the state, and (2) for all other contracts, that neither vendor nor any related party owe a debt as defined above and that neither vendor nor any related party are in employer default as defined above, unless the debt or employer default is permitted under the exception above.
