SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE: The West Virginia Division of Natural Resources is soliciting bids on behalf of the Wildlife Resources Section to establish an Open-End contract to supply all transportation, labor and supervision necessary to provide Limestone Sand to the watersheds identified in Section 6.1.1, hereinafter referred to as the "South Zone".
- 2. **DEFINITIONS:** The terms listed below shall have the meanings assigned to them below. Additional definitions can be found in section 2 of the General Terms and Conditions.
 - 2.1 "Contract Item" or "Contract Items" means the list of items identified in Section 3.1 below and on the Pricing Pages.
 - 2.2 "Pricing Page" means the schedule of prices, estimated order quantity, and totals contained in wvOASIS or attached hereto and used to evaluate the Solicitation responses.
 - 2.3 "Solicitation" means the official notice of an opportunity to supply the State with goods or services that is published by the WV Division of Natural Resources.

3. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- 3.1 Contract Items and Mandatory Requirements: Vendor shall provide Agency with the Contract Items listed below on an open-end and continuing basis. Contract Items must meet or exceed the mandatory requirements as shown below.

- 3.1.4 The vendor shall interact directly with the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources representative to be identified within the award documents..
- 3.1.5 Quantity of Limestone Sand will be directed by these same representatives.

4. CONTRACT AWARD:

- 4.1 Contract Award: The Contract is intended to provide Agencies with a purchase price on all Contract Items in the South Zone. The Contract shall be awarded to the Vendor that provides the Contract Items meeting the required specifications for the lowest TOTAL BID AMOUNT as shown on the Pricing Pages.
- 4.2 Pricing Page: Vendor should complete the Exhibit A Pricing Page by providing the price per ton delivered to each location.
 - Vendor should complete the Pricing Page in its entirety as failure to do so may result in Vendor's bids being disqualified.
- 4.3 The Pricing Pages contain a list of the Contract Items and estimated purchase volume. The estimated purchase volume for each item represents the approximate volume of anticipated purchases only. Actual volume and delivery locations within watersheds may vary from those provided in Exhibits SOUTH-A through SOUTH-I and on the Pricing Page. No future use of the Contract or any individual item is guaranteed or implied.

5. ORDERING AND PAYMENT:

- 5.1 Ordering: Vendor shall accept orders through wvOASIS, regular mail, facsimile, email, or any other written form of communication. Vendor may, but is not required to, accept on-line orders through a secure internet ordering portal/website. If Vendor has the ability to accept on-line orders, it should include in its response a brief description of how Agencies may utilize the on-line ordering system. - 5.2 Payment: Vendor shall accept payment in accordance with the payment procedures of the State of West Virginia.

6. DELIVERY AND RETURN:

- 6.1 Delivery Time: Vendor shall deliver standard orders as scheduled after orders are received. Vendor will be contacted in advance to meet for delivery. Vendor shall deliver emergency orders within 24 hours after orders are received. Vendor shall ship all orders in accordance with the above schedule and shall not hold orders until a minimum delivery quantity is met.

- 6.2 Late Delivery: The Section placing the order under this Contract must be notified in writing if orders will be delayed for any reason. Any delay in delivery that could cause harm to an Agency will be grounds for cancellation of the delayed order, and/or obtaining the items ordered from a third party.

Any Section seeking to obtain items from a third party under this provision must first obtain approval of the Chief Procurement Officer.

- 6.3 Delivery Payment/Risk of Loss: Standard order delivery shall be F.O.B. destination to the Agency's desired location. Vendor shall include the cost of standard order delivery charges in its bid pricing/discount and is not permitted to charge the Agency separately for such delivery. The Agency will pay delivery charges on all emergency orders provided that Vendor invoices those delivery costs as a separate charge with the original freight bill attached to the invoice.
- 6.4 Return of Unacceptable Items: If the Agency deems the Contract Items to be unacceptable, the Contract Items shall be returned to Vendor at Vendor's expense and with no restocking charge. Vendor shall either make arrangements for the return within five (5) days of being notified that items are unacceptable, or permit the Agency to arrange for the return and reimburse Agency for delivery expenses. If the original packaging cannot be utilized for the return, Vendor will supply the Agency with appropriate return packaging upon request. All returns of unacceptable items shall be F.O.B. the Agency's location. The returned product shall either be replaced, or the Agency shall receive a full credit or refund for the purchase price, at the Agency's discretion.
- 6.5 Return Due to Agency Error: Items ordered in error by the Agency will be returned for credit within 30 days of receipt, F.O.B. Vendor's location. Vendor shall not charge a restocking fee if returned products are in a resalable condition. Items shall be deemed to be in a resalable condition if they are unused and in the original packaging. Any restocking fee for items not in a resalable condition shall be the lower of the Vendor's customary restocking fee or 5% of the total invoiced value of the returned items.

These instructions provide critical information about requirements that if overlooked could lead to disqualification of a Vendor's bid. All bids must be submitted in accordance with the provisions contained in these instructions and the Solicitation. Failure to do so may result in disqualification of a Vendor's bid.
- 2. MANDATORY TERMS: The Solicitation may contain mandatory provisions identified by the use of the words "must," "will," and "shall" which identify a mandatory item or requirement. Failure to comply with a mandatory term in the Solicitation will result in bid disqualification.






